#### What does 'access' cover?

The call is open t

-Italian users willing to access ACTRIS facilities, and to foreign users willing to access the Italian ACTRIS facilities.

-foreign users interested in accessing the Italian ACTRIS facilities.

#### Key Information:

- Application deadline: 28st April 2025

- Review: upon submission

Access period; starting from the approval – to be concluded by 31st July 2025.

Topic: general call. No topic restriction and researchers from multidisciplinary projects are encouraged to opply.

Financial support to users: Users will receive a one-off ground other the access successfully completed.
 The final amount of the grout will be calculated after the access is completed at the facility and disbursed by the ACTRS ERIC following the provider's confirmation of access. The grant is assigned exclusively to individuals not institutions, and it will be disbursed directly to each user by the ACTRS ERIC.
 Researchers From different disciplines are recovariged to apply.

Proposals should be submitted via the PASS platform (Platform for managing user access to ACTRIS Services), where submission guidelines and full details are available.

We encourage researchers to submit applications early for timely consideration.

A Important Update - ITINERIS-ACTRIS Pilot Access Call

We are pleased to announce that the decaline to submit a proposal under the ITINERIS-ACTRIS Plot Access Call has been extended from 31 March to 28 April.

The available budget has also been increased from €500,000 to €903,000, enabling us to support a greater number of high-quality access projects.

Each selected user will be awarded a **one-off grant of up** to €5,000 to cover travel and subsistence costs. In addition, a **maximum reimbursement of €20,000** will be available for the access provider, per single access.

Please note that, in the event that the total funding requested for positively evaluated proposals exceeds the available budget, proposals will be funded based on the order in which they are received (first corne, first served basis).

We encourage all applicants to submit their proposals as soon as possible.







### Percentage of Italian and foreign users



### Foreign Users – Affiliation Institution Country











# Travel and subsistence cost calculation



- 1. Based on flat rates for Travel (variable depending on the distance travelled) and Subsistence (variable depending on the country where the access takes place)
- 2. Preliminary calculation based on the information in the Application form, included in the award letter → by SAMU
- 3. Final amount of the grant determined based on the information in the provider's CoA

## Provider's reimbursement calculation



- 1. The provider's reimbursement per access project is determined by multiplying the unit cost (declared for the facility and used in other EU projects) and the quantity of access declared in the CoA. Alternatively, the provider's reimbursement is based on the real cost reported.
- 2. To proceed with reimbursement, a service-level agreement can be signed between the ERIC and the provider institution.
