

About ICRI's Privacy Policy

This Privacy Policy will explain how ICRI uses the personal data collected from you when using the ICRI 2026 website or registering for the event. By using this website, downloading the ICRI 2026 App, participating in third-party social networks (e.g., Instagram and LinkedIn), willingly providing us with your personal data when registering for the event or proposing a question online, you accept the collection and processing of your personal data as described in this privacy policy.

ICRI 2026 values your privacy and is committed to using your data only for the necessary purposes stated in this privacy policy.

What data does ICRI 2026 collect?

ICRI 2026 collects:

- **Personal identification information** (e.g., name, email address, job title, institutional affiliation, country, etc).
- **Speaker data:** a **photo** and **short biography** when you have a speaking role at Conference
- **Event media: photography and filming** during in-person event
- **Website data:** **cookies** used for analytical purposes.

ICRI 2026 states it **does not collect or store sensitive personal information.**

How does ICRI collect your data?

Most data is collected **directly from you**, for example when you:

- Register online for the Conference
- Voluntarily submit questions
- Accept a speaker role and provide (or approve use of) your photo and bio.
- Subscribe to the ICRI 2026 mailing list.
- Use/view the website (via browser cookies).
- Use ICRI 2026 social media pages.

ICRI 2026 also uses third-party services to collect/process data (CNR INDICO) and recommends reading their privacy policies.

Data collection and how is it used: overview

Main use cases include:

- **Conference registration:** process registration; participation analysis; optional mailing list subscription; optional invitations to external events.
 - Data can include: name, email address, job title, institutional affiliation, country, accessibility needs, dietary restrictions (if applicable).
 - Process registration and provide access link; a **participants list** may be shared with third parties (i.e external agencies) for production of conference on-site materials and organization of external events

- **Submitting questions:** manage and publish your question during the event. Questions may be published with your **name, job title, affiliation, nationality**. Recordings may be posted on ICRI 2026 social media. Email is used only if ICRI 2026 needs to contact you.
- **Speakers:** publish speaker info (excluding email) in program materials, the ICRI 2026 App, and the speakers section of the website. Speaker pages from past events may remain online. Contact details are not published but may be stored for direct coordination.
- **Emails to Secretariat:** used for customer support.
- **Mailing list:** used to send announcements and information on ICRI 2026 events/publications; stored in INDICO until you unsubscribe.
- **In-person photography/filming** and **website cookies** are handled under their respective sections.

How does ICRI 2026 store your data?

ICRI stores data at National Research Council of Italy, CNR, in Rome (Italy). The website hosting is also based in Italy. Some service providers involved in data processing are **globally located**. ICRI 2026 states it applies internal procedures and security standards to protect personal data, while noting that no online environment can be guaranteed fully secure.

How long will your data be stored?

ICRI 2026 stores personal data **as long as necessary** to:

- deliver services described in the policy,
- conduct analytical purposes,
- meet legal obligations,
- or follow special agreements with you. It notes that certain laws (e.g., accounting/limitation rules) may require or allow **longer retention** in some cases.

What are your data protection rights?

Users have rights including:

- **Access** (copies of your data)
- **Rectification** (correct inaccurate/incomplete data),
- **Erasure** (under certain conditions),
- **Restriction of processing** (under certain conditions),
- **Objection to processing** (under certain conditions),
- **Data portability** (under certain conditions).

ICRI 2026 notes restricting/objecting may reduce service quality. ICRI 2026 aims to respond within **one week**. Contact: icri2026@cnr.it

What are cookies?

Cookies are small files stored by your browser that can support site functionality and collect usage information (the policy references cookies mainly for analytics).

How does ICRI 2026 use cookies, and what types of cookies does it use?

With regard to the active ICRI 2026 accounts on the social media platforms Instagram (<https://www.instagram.com/icri.rome.2026/>) and LinkedIn (<https://www.linkedin.com/company/icri-rome-2026/>), certain personal data may be acquired by the operators of these platforms whenever the User chooses to interact with the relevant plug-ins. Furthermore, when sharing content on the main social networks (Instagram and LinkedIn), additional personal data may be collected by the operators of the aforementioned platforms each time the User interacts with the related plug-ins.
